

Joyce has been a group travel organiser for 35 years, taking members all over the world to the likes of Spain, Canada, Austria, Cyprus and most recently, Montenegro.

When she first began organising for the U3A group, there were 70 members and she has grown it to more than 400 with many people who join the branch doing so because they have heard about the holidays available to book.

Joyce prides herself on coming up with new ideas of where to go and told us: "I rarely repeat the same location within three years. I like to look at where we went the previous year and then look in the opposite direction."



Arranging a range of day outings and UK breaks, as well as European and long-haul holidays, Joyce caters for various interests. Asked what the most rewarding aspect of her role as a GTO is, Joyce said: "Seeing smiles at the end of a trip. I also look out for people who are on their first trip, perhaps since a bereavement."

"It is rewarding when you see these people joining in and laughing. Several of my members have made new friends this way and now they will share with one of their new friends rather than having a single room."

The Basingstoke Canal route of 37 miles was approved by Parliament in 1778.

- · John Pinkerton (after whom our boat was named) was awarded the contract.
- · The canal was completed in 1794 at a cost of £154,163.
- It ran from wharves in Basingstoke town centre to the River Wey Navigation at Byfleet.
- · Timber, flour and chalk were the main cargoes to London, returning with coal and fertiliser.
- · 1923, A.J. Harmsworth bought the canal & secured contracts, carrying coal/timber to Woking.
- · After his death in 1947, the canal fell into increasing decay.
- · In the 1970s, Hampshire & Surrey County Councils took control of their sections of the canal.
- · Over 17 years, they funded a programme of restoration.

In May 1991, it was formally re-opened by HRH the Duke of Kent, with 32 miles of navigable waterway from Greywell Tunnel to the the River Wey Navigation.

u3a Canasta

Canasta is one of those card games that can be played equally well by 2, 3, or 4 players. Many discussions took place during the first Basingstoke

U3A session along the lines of "I haven't played since I was at college / still a child / 40/50/60 years ago".

However, like riding a bike, the skill came back quickly, and a set of 'u3a rules' is available — we all had our own minor variations on the

set of 'u3a rules' is available – we all had our own minor variations on the theme!

The game is played with two standard packs of playing cards plus all 4 jokers, the jokers and the 2s being 'wild' cards. The aim of the game is to score as many points as possible from 'Canastas' (seven or more cards, either all with the same face value or at least four plus 'wild' cards) that have been 'melded' (declared). The hand finishes when one player, has 'melded' all their cards including at least one Canasta; ideally when the opponents still have many cards in hand, which will earn them a negative score!

The skill of the game lies in melding as many cards as possible, while not leaving a shortage of cards to complete the Canasta needed to go out (and completed Canastas score bonus points too), and not discarding cards your opponents can use.

The Basingstoke group meets every month on the first and third Monday afternoons (except bank holidays) in Christ

Church, Chineham, 2.00–4.30pm. While the group was originally for experienced players only, we are now happy to welcome those who would also like to learn in a friendly atmosphere.
